Headteacher's Update

Marvellous Me!

Many thanks to those who have joined Marvellous Me! We have had a brilliant initial response and currently have 147 parents signed up.

We would love to be able to send all parents messages and information about their children's amazing learning. If you require any help, please do not hesitate to contact us. Please note, after half term we will be using Marvellous Me to contact you if your child will be receiving an award in celebration, rather than sending a letter. Lots of key messages will be coming via this app in the future.

You may have noticed in the parent app that there is a 'High Five' icon. This tells your child's teacher that you have received the Marvellous Me. It would help us if you could tap this icon each time you receive a message.

As a parent using this app with my daughter, I love being able to chat with her about the Marvellous Me messages I receive. It is an ideal way to open discussions with your child about their learning - especially if your child, like mine, will always say they have done nothing or cannot remember!!

Visiting classrooms, it is clear that the children and staff are very motivated about Marvellous Me and excited to have an instant link between home and school.

Headlice

We appreciate that parents are frustrated with the incidents of headlice. Several parents have found the treatments don't achieve much more than special or tea tree shampoos and conditioners. Parents have also advised that left in conditioner works better at trying to deter them from latching on. The comb is the best treatment of all for catching the lice. Local pharmacies and supermarkets sell suitable products.

We have been notified of some incidents in the school so please check your child's hair and treat if necessary on a regular basis.

With the excitement of the new term has come the purchase of new pencil cases and a vast amount of stationery! I have asked teachers to ensure that learning is not distracted in anyway and that the pencil cases are kept in trays and used as appropriate.

Celebration Assembly

We look forward to welcoming you to celebrate your child's learning in a variety of school events including celebration assembly. Please can I ask that when you attend the celebrations of your child's learning that you turn off mobile phones and ensure when the children enter the hall, that they receive your full focus.

Did you know that registering for Pupil Premium means that Bearwood Primary and Nursery School could receive funding for your child?

Pupil Premium is additional funding that the Government gives to mainstream and special schools in England to help children from low income families. The Pupil Premium Grant must be spent to help eligible pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

For each eligible child the school will receive £1,300 of additional funding.

Pupil premium is allocated to pupils from low income families and the eligibility check is identical to the Free School Meals eligibility check. Qualifying benefits are as follows:

- Income Support
- Jobseeker's Allowance (income-based)
- Employment and Support Allowance (income-based)
- Child Tax Credit based on income below £16,190
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Asylum Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'run on' (this is the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

Please be aware families who receive any level of Working Tax Credit are not entitled to free school meals.
