Maths Challenge

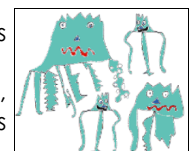
As there have been no entries handed into Mrs Mitson yet, the maths challenge will run for another week. Have a go and a prize could be yours!

Collecting Shoes for UNICEF

Hosting the ShoeShare collection supports your RRSA accreditation, contributing towards criteria 18 in Standard D: Children and young people are empowered to become active citizens and learners.

Please ensure that:

- The shoes are paired with a rubber band to make it easier to sort and pack (We can supply these)
- The shoes are in relatively good condition – so no holes or broken soles!
- Shoes can be children and adults.

Please drop shoes off in the community room during the week and we will take to Clarks on Friday.

Headlice
