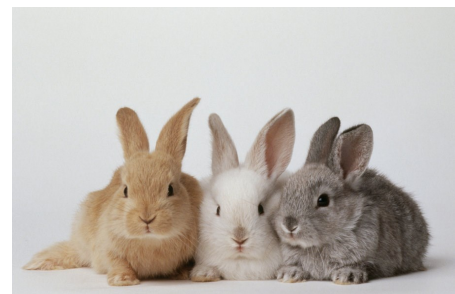


Environment Award

We are very pleased to announce that thanks to the hard work of the children throughout this year, we have been awarded the Gold Level of the Environment Award. The School Council have worked hard to raise the profile of environmental issues through Class Council sessions. We have developed composting, planted new trees in the garden, worked with the RSPB to examine our school grounds and develop them further to improve the potential to support wildlife. Alongside this, the children have raised the profile of the need to recycle and be safe on the roads. We provided every child in Key Stage One and Early Years with a high vis vest and the Key Stage Two children with a set of bike lights and led our own 'Great Plastic Pick Up' at the Charter Road Play Area to help the children develop pride in our local community. We are currently awaiting a date for the presentation of our award!
