Outdoor Learning Grant

We are delighted to announce that we have been awarded a Local School Nature Grant, thanks to players of the People's Postcode Lottery. Our pupils will be benefiting from outdoor den equipment, a woodland activity kit, a ground covering kit and an all-year-round outdoor learning kit which will be used to enable all year groups to increase learning opportunities outside the classroom. In addition staff will receive training to help children learn outdoors. The project is run by Learning through Landscapes and is funded by Postcode Local Trust, which receives funding from players of the People's Postcode Lottery.

Holidays in Term Time

During the last academic year, 54 children took holiday in term time.... this is 25% of the school!

As you are aware, good attendance is essential to school success. Since the start of the term we have had a number of requests for holidays in term time. The school's policy is that anyone found to have taken an unauthorised term time holiday will be liable to be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice. Fining will also be initiated when a total of five unauthorised days are recorded in separate blocks. We greatly value the positive relationship between home and school and we do not want the issue of holidays to create a conflict in this relationship. Taking holiday during term time will have an impact on your child's attendance throughout the academic year and valuable learning time will be lost. With this in mind, we ask that careful consideration is given before bookings are made.

As a school we have to report absences (authorised and unauthorised) to the Local Authority. The Local Authority issue fines of £60 for taking children on holiday without permission. The £60 fine increases to £120 if you fail to pay within 21 days of the fine being issued. If you don't pay within 28 days you can be taken to magistrates' court under the Education Act 1996. If found guilty you could end up with a criminal record and face a fine of up to £2,500, court costs or even a jail sentence of up to three months. Please be aware our Local Authority takes holidays in term time seriously - one Poole family recently had their fine increased to £1000 for failure to pay and were visited by bailiffs.
