This newsletter is to let you know about all of the exciting things that the children will be learning in Holly 2 over the next half term.

Learning Journey!

At Bearwood we are developing our curriculum and will be focusing on a Learning Journey each half term. This term our question is "What makes me, me?" We will be covering the following subjects through this topic:

History

We will be learning about very recent history in line with "What makes me, me?". We will, therefore, be looking at the late 1970's and 1980's to study the era in which Holly 2 parents were born and experienced their childhood. This will involve an exploration of items used daily in the 1980's which the children will not be familiar with and some comparisons on clothes and music. We will also begin to develop our chronology skills when creating a timeline of events within our lifetime.



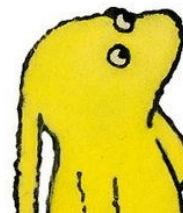
Art

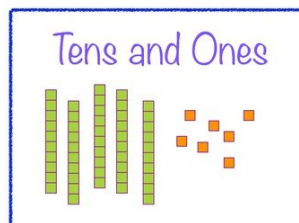
English

Children who have recently had their ears pierced should cover them with tape, **but once they have healed they must not wear earrings for any PE lessons**.

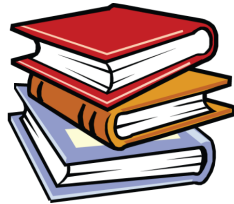
Holly 2 Class Charter
