

What is Parent View? Parent View is an online questionnaire for parents and carers to feed back on their child's school to OFSTED.

Once a school has a sufficient number of responses from parents/carers, results will be published in percentages in easy-to-understand graphs. They can then be viewed by schools, parents and carers and the general public on the Parent View website. <https://parentview.ofsted.gov.uk/parent-view-results>
