Tucasi Online Payment System (SCOPAY)

As you are aware from previous communications at the beginning of March we will now be using our Online Payment System (SCOPAY). The system allows you to view balances and pay for trips and events online without the need to send cash or cheques into school as we become a Cashless Office after Easter. Parents who were not already registered on the system or who needed to add siblings were sent a letter in December which detailed how to register and how to add an account for another child.
