### Headteacher's Update

Online Parent Safeguarding Questionnaire 2019. As promised, here is further feedback regarding the questionnaire.

#### Question

**'My child knows what to do in the event of a fire in school'**

#### Response: (63)

74.6% - Agree  
23.8% - Disagree  
1.6% - Don't know

Our Site Manager, Mr Lee, tests the fire alarms each week to ensure that they are fully functional in each area of the school. In addition to this we have four fully trained fire wardens who have a responsibility during fire evacuation. Each term we have a fire drill which varies depending upon the term. In the Autumn term, all staff and children are aware of the drill, especially the younger children who can become startled by the noise. In the Spring term, only senior leaders are aware of the drill and finally in the summer term, Mr Lee surprises us all and will set the fire alarm off. All drills are treated as if there were a real fire and policy and procedure followed. All pupils understand the importance of evacuating the building from the nearest fire exit and lining up in the designated area. It is very impressive to watch! We have even had a fire drill during a lunch time as you never know when it might happen!

### 100% Attendance Award

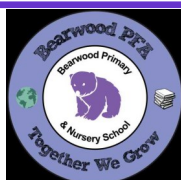
