### Headteacher's Update

We are delighted to be welcoming 20 Chinese students and 3 teachers to our school on Wednesday 26th June. They are travelling all the way from Zhengzhou City which is in the He Nan province, an area rich in history and the home of a high tech science park. Zhengzhou played a vital role in the early civilization of China as the site of an early Shang dynasty, a walled city nearly 3,500 years ago. Their Shaolin Temple is a famous tourist spot which originates from the 5th Century and is the main temple for the Shaolin School of Buddhism and Shaolin Martial Arts - Kungfu.

The children are staying in our country for two weeks, spending 6 days with us where they will be participating in class lessons, learning all about our culture and sharing theirs with us and the remaining time visiting Cambridge, Oxford, the London Eye, Windsor Castle and central London tours.

We know the children will make them feel very welcome and are looking forward to meeting them. It will be an exciting time of learning and sharing for all!

On Tuesday 18th June, children in Years 3 - 6 were lucky enough to be able to attend another of the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra's children's concerts. This year, the theme was 'Space and Exploration'.
