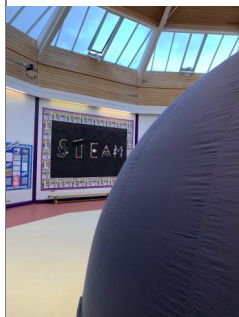

Planetarium

Last week, we were incredibly lucky to have our very own Planetarium in the hall to allow the children to explore space. Year 6 had a tour of the Solar System and learnt about the movement of the Sun, whilst Year 3, 4 and 5 focused on Earth and Year 1, 2 and Reception found out about Space Exploration. This was a fantastic opportunity for all children to share their natural curiosity and explore new areas of learning.



Reading Records

Reading is such an important skill that we ask for children to read at home for 10-15 minutes each night to help the children develop this skill. The children's reading records are a place for reading at home to be recorded and as a school we monitor this to ensure all children are reading. When we hear children read in school, we record this in different ways, but this will not be recorded in the children's reading records. It made me fall asleep.***

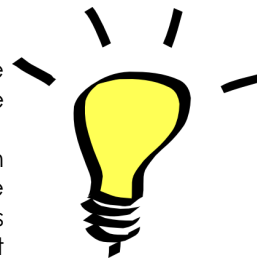
***I woke up from the strangest dream,

Kids Invent Stuff

Children are encouraged to submit their ideas for inventions to solve a different challenge each month. The most creative inventions are showcased on their channel and each month one idea is built and tested on camera, with hilarious consequences. Our children have been shown this month's challenge, which is to make an invention for a hotel room. Maths Workshops

Last week the whole school were lucky to have maths workshops run by Barney at House of Maths. In Maple 1, he taught us to use peg boards and elastic bands to make different sized shapes. We investigated different ways to find half of the shapes, by counting the squares inside each shape to check it was equal. After that, he taught us to find other fractions like thirds and quarters.
