Attendance

Last year we have a significant improvement in attendance with our overall attendance being over the National Average. We are keen to build on this further this year. With this in mind, we wanted to remind you of the following:

- We are able to administer Calpol to your child during the school day. Often with mild seasonal viruses, this is enough to enable them to manage the day.
- We are able to antibiotics provided they are prescribed for four times a day. Please complete a form from the Office.
- Children who have had sickness and diarrhoea should not return to school until 48 hours after the last episode to prevent spreading.
- Holidays taken in term time will result in a fine from the Local Authority and will not be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances. Fines are issued per child per parent so a week of holiday could result in a £240 if you have two children in the school.

We are keen to work in partnership with parents. If there is anything we can do to support you with attendance issues, please make an appointment to see Mrs Gunstone our Attendance Leader.
