Oak 2 Home Learning

Please can you use the writing pack to practice letter formation for capital and lower case letters.

All the children need to practise reading phase 3 tricky words which are on the sheet in the writing pack. They are - all, he, me, she, we, be, you, are, they, was.

The children have started to learn said, have, like, come, some and there. Please practise reading these.

Please practise spelling - I, no, go, into, the, to, we, me, she, he and be. We will be sending home a tricky word bingo to help practice these words.

We have been learning the letter names for all letters in the alphabet. Please practise this at home. There are a lot of alphabet songs on You Tube.

Twinkl.com is a site online which has a wealth of games and power points which support your child's learning. Whilst the school is shut, you as parents, can access this site and use the resources.

Each child in Oak 1 and Oak 2 will be bringing home a bean or sunflower seed to plant at home. It would be helpful if children could keep a diary of any changes that happen. This could be done by photographs, writing lists or, if your child is able, writing observations in a sentence. We have been enjoying planting, weeding and digging in our base garden. It would be fantastic if whilst at home children could continue this is they have a garden accessible to them.

In class we are making sure we can order all numbers to 20 and find 1 less and 1 more. I will be sending home number lines for the children to practice this. Watching Numberblocks supports many of the skills we learn in maths.

Please use this time to read and share many stories and non-fiction texts with your child. If they have a reading book please practise reading daily as normal. Our class story is Jack and the Beanstalk. It would be helpful if you could share this and other traditional tales with your child.
