

'Great British Bake Off'

Firstly, I would like to say how well all the children have settled back into school and how lovely it has been to see their enthusiasm for learning.

Next week, we will begin our new topic 'The Great British Bake Off.' As part of this topic, the children will learn the story of the 'Little Red Hen' and explore what we can make with flour.

To begin the topic, the children will get the opportunity to taste a variety of different bread-based products and compare the texture, look and taste of the breads. These will include:-

- Naan bread
- French bread
- Brown bread
- White bread and
- Pitta Bread

In the coming weeks, we will continue to bake other flour-based products during our continuous provision time in the class. 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Phonics

This week the children have been recapping the phonemes they have learnt over the last half term. If your child is unsure of a few sounds, it would be most beneficial to practise them little and often at home to reinforce the learning in school.
